**DESCRIPTION:** The following position is offered as a field placement through the Region IV Public Health Training Center (<u>http://www.sph.emory.edu/r4phtc</u>).

The mission of the Coastal Health District and the County Boards of Health in Bryan, Camden, Chatham, Effingham, Glynn, Liberty, Long, and McIntosh counties is to improve the health of those who live, work, and play in those counties by preventing disease, injury and disability; promoting health and well-being; and preparing for and responding to disasters.

POSITION DESCRIPTION: The Chronic Disease Prevention Program is currently working on multiple health promotion and education projects. Utilizing the Blue Zones Power 9 Principles, an intern will assist the Chronic Disease Prevention Program in designing a worksite wellness program for Coastal Health District employees. They will also assist in outreach education events/sessions that address hypertension and diabetes prevention by providing community health screenings and delivering prevention education. The student may help with developing, synthesizing, and updating teaching material for health education programs. The team would need assistance to prioritize existing materials, add resources, and help create material appropriate for health literacy levels to teach participants how to better prevent or manage chronic disease.

THE STUDENT WILL HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO:

- 1. Assess existing health education materials for worksite wellness, hypertension, and diabetes education
- 2. Find, develop, and/or update supplemental materials to fill gaps and needs
- 3. Compile program materials to fit the health literacy and culturally appropriate needs of the Coastal Health District populations served

### QUALIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS TO APPLY:

Candidates must be masters or doctoral level public health students. Students graduating in August 2020 can still apply, but must complete the program prior to graduation. Past recipients of the Pathways to Practice Award are not eligible to apply again.

Preferred, but not required - The ideal candidate for this internship would:

- 1) Have experience with developing and/or refining educational materials
- 2) Have experience and interest in chronic disease prevention: diabetes, physical activity, and/or nutrition education

Your cover letter should include the title of the position you are applying to and citizenship or permanent resident visa status. In your resume, include the name of your degree program, department, year of study (e.g. 1<sup>st</sup> year MPH student), and expected graduation date. Please send an unofficial transcript and a writing sample.

#### WORK AUTHORIZATION: U.S. Citizen, Permanent U.S. Resident

Citizenship statement: The Region IV Public Health Training Center is a federally-funded program which has a citizenship requirement. To be eligible to apply for this position, you must be either a U.S. citizen, a non-citizen U.S. national, or a foreign national having in your possession a visa permitting permanent residence in the U.S.

#### AWARD LEVEL: \$3500 award

\* Note: travel costs will not be covered by the program beyond the total \$3500 award.

DURATION: Approximately 8-12 weeks; May-August 2020

### APPROXIMATE HOURS PER WEEK: Approximately 20-40 hours

\*Students may be limited in the minimum or maximum number of hours they can work per semester based on their university, school or degree's policies. If this work will be also be used as a graduation requirement, the student should verify those requirements and abide by their university policies.
