DESCRIPTION: The following position is offered as a field placement through the Region IV Public Health Training Center (<u>http://www.sph.emory.edu/r4phtc</u>).

NOTE: The position duties may be conducted remotely with the possibility of hybrid in-person work late fall/spring, as safety allows.

The Mississippi Public Health Institute (MSPHI) mission is to engage in partnerships and activities that improve the health of Mississippians. We work across four primary domains: Public and Behavioral Health; Maternal Child Health; Chronic Disease and Community Health. The services MSPHI provides are project management, evaluation, training and technical assistance, convening, technological services and fiscal intermediary.

POSITION DESCRIPTION: The MS Behavioral Health Learning Network (MSBLN) is a program of the MS Public Health Institute that provides workforce development training for professionals in the substance use disorder treatment and prevention fields. The student will be working closely with the MSPHI workforce development staff to research and develop course content, contact speakers, assist in develop a training catalog, evaluate trainings and assist in generating solutions for reaching professionals in this COVID-19 environment.

THE STUDENT WILL HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO:

- 1. Assist in developing training content for the Behavioral Health Learning Network webinars.
- 2. Assist in researching training topics for Behavioral Health Learning Network and assist in developing the training catalog.
- 3. Assist in identifying speakers and securing content descriptions.
- 4. Participate in behavioral health webinars to learn more about the field and evaluate the training content.

POSITION TYPE: Region IV Public Health Training Center Field Placements (for MPH/MSPH students)

QUALIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS TO APPLY:

Preference may be given to masters or doctoral level public health graduate students. However, social work, sociology, and psychology graduate students are also eligible to apply. Students must complete the program prior to graduation. Past recipients of the Pathways to Practice Award are not eligible to apply again.

Your cover letter should include the semesters you are applying for (FA20, SP21, or either), the title of the position you are applying to, and citizenship or permanent resident visa status. In your resume, include the name of your degree program, department, year of study (e.g. 1st year MPH student), and expected graduation date. Please also send a writing sample and your unofficial transcript.

WORK AUTHORIZATION: U.S. Citizen, Permanent U.S. Resident

Citizenship statement: The Region IV Public Health Training Center is a federally-funded program which has a citizenship requirement. To be eligible to apply for this position, you must be either a U.S. citizen, a non-citizen U.S. national, or a foreign national having in your possession a visa permitting permanent residence in the U.S.

AWARD LEVEL: \$3500 award

* Note: travel costs will not be covered by the program beyond the total \$3500 award.

APPROXIMATE HOURS PER WEEK & DURATION: Approximately 20 hours a week for 10 weeks. *Students may be limited in the minimum or maximum number of hours they can work per semester based on their university, school or degree's policies. If this work will be also be used as a graduation requirement, the student should verify those requirements and abide by their university policies.
