**DESCRIPTION:** The following position is offered as a field placement through the Region IV Public Health Training Center (<http://www.sph.emory.edu/r4phtc>).

*Note: The internship will be 100% remote except for three in-person meetings.*

Converge was founded on a shared vision that all Mississippians could access quality, affordable, sexual and reproductive health services. Converge is a nonprofit dedicated to ensuring all people in Mississippi have access to high-quality reproductive services when, how, and where they need them. Converge collaborates with health care providers, insurance companies, and community partners to build a health care system that places people at the center of family planning care.

**POSITION DESCRIPTION:** The student will primarily focus on Converge's telehealth initiative. The telehealth initiative is one of Converge's main projects that aims to make reproductive healthcare more accessible for Mississippians. The telehealth project will launch in early summer, and the student will interact with many parts of it during this internship period. Staff will provide one-on-one support to the intern to help provide a learning environment that centers the intern's needs and special interests.

The field placement will be virtual, except for three in-person meetings. The intern will travel to three events/meetings throughout the field placement experience.

#### **REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Effective communication skills
- Strong interpersonal skills
- Strong writing skills

#### **THE STUDENT WILL HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO ASSIST WITH THE FOLLOWING ACTIVITIES:**

- Participate in the telehealth initiative (promoting the telehealth services/reproductive health kits, participating in team meetings, organizing/assisting with creating content for social media accounts, and other tasks as assigned).

- Collect sexual and reproductive health data from clinics across Mississippi to assist with the data collection for clinic finder.
- Assist the Community Engagement Manager with community engagement activities and events.

**QUALIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS TO APPLY:**

Preference will be given to masters or doctoral level public health graduate students. Will also consider undergraduate public health students (juniors and seniors). Students must complete the program prior to graduation. [Past recipients of the Pathways to Practice Award are not eligible to apply again.](#)

Your cover letter should include the semesters you are applying for (Summer 2023), the title of the position you are applying to, and citizenship or permanent resident visa status. In your resume, include the name of your degree program, department, year of study (e.g. 1<sup>st</sup> year MPH student), and expected graduation date. **Please also send a writing sample.**

**WORK AUTHORIZATION:** U.S. Citizen, Permanent U.S. Resident

Citizenship statement: The Region IV Public Health Training Center is a federally-funded program which has a citizenship requirement. To be eligible to apply for this position, you must be either a U.S. citizen, a non-citizen U.S. national, or a foreign national having in your possession a visa permitting permanent residence in the U.S.

**AWARD LEVEL:** \$3,500 award

\* Note: Travel costs will not be covered by the program beyond the total \$3,500 award.

**APPROXIMATE HOURS PER WEEK & DURATION:** Approximately 20-40 hours a week for 8-12 weeks.

*\*Students may be limited in the minimum or maximum number of hours they can work per semester based on their university, school or degree's policies. If this work will be also be used as a graduation requirement, the student should verify those requirements and abide by their university policies.*
