POSITION DESCRIPTION:

During the field placement experience with the New Season Treatment Center, the student will have the opportunity to work with patients to complete intake, admission, and aftercare assistance. The student will also document patients progress through counseling and interaction through groups. Included in this work, the student will complete patient psychological and an individualized treatment plan within a required specific time frame and help to identify any clinical/case management needs and work to address those needs.

- Actively participates in community relations activities as directed and authorized
- Work with patients to complete intake, admission, and aftercare assistance

WORK AUTHORIZATION: U.S. Citizen, Permanent U.S. Resident

Citizenship statement: The Region IV Public Health Training Center is a federally funded program which has a citizenship requirement. To be eligible to apply for this position, you must be either a U.S. citizen, a non-citizen U.S. national, or a foreign national having in your possession a visa permitting permanent residence in the U.S.
