DESCRIPTION:

POSITION DESCRIPTION:

The student will be involved in a range of public health initiatives that integrate epidemiology, health education, and community outreach. The student will assist with data collection and analysis for ongoing surveillance projects, contribute to community health assessments, and support the development and implementation of STI prevention and health equity initiatives. They will also help organize and evaluate outreach events, assist with health education programming, and create culturally tailored materials to engage priority populations. This placement offers a well-rounded experience that bridges data-driven public health practice with community-based interventions, providing the student with valuable insight into applied public health at the local level.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Strong written and verbal communication skills.
- Basic understanding of public health principles and data collection methods.
- Familiarity with Microsoft Office (Excel, Word, PowerPoint); experience with data tools like REDCap, Tableau or ESRI is a plus.
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team.
- Interest in health equity, STI prevention, and community health improvement.
- Professionalism, reliability, and a willingness to learn in a dynamic public health environment.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Ability to maintain confidentiality and adhere to HIPAA and public health data privacy standards.
- Strong organizational and time management skills.
- Basic proficiency in Microsoft Office (Word, Excel, PowerPoint).
- Effective written and verbal communication skills.
- Willingness to engage with diverse populations and participate in community-based activities

WORK AUTHORIZATION: U.S. Citizen, Permanent U.S. Resident

Citizenship statement: The Region IV Public Health Training Center is a federally-funded program which has a citizenship requirement. To be eligible to apply for this position, you must be either a U.S. citizen, a non-citizen U.S. national, or a foreign national having in your possession a visa permitting permanent residence in the U.S.

AWARD LEVEL: \$3,500 award

* Note: Travel costs will not be covered by the program beyond the total \$3,500 award.

APPROXIMATE HOURS PER WEEK & DURATION: Approximately 20-30 hours a week for 10-12 weeks.
